Many aging adults are facing a crisis. Two factors — longer life spans and aging baby boomers — will combine to increase the population of Americans aged 65 years and older to roughly 20% of the U.S. population by 2030.

While 90% of people over age 65 want to remain at home as they age¹, a lack of affordable services means that this dream cannot become a reality for many on a low, fixed income.

Simultaneously, there is a shortage of professionals to care for this aging population. Topping the list of occupations expected to grow between 2012 and 2022 are personal care aides, in the No. 1 slot (580,800 new positions); home health aides, No. 4 (424,200 jobs); and nursing assistants, No. 6 (312,200 jobs). Together, it is mind-boggling: more than 1.3 million new paid caregivers will be needed to meet demand over the next decade.²

Enter the **Family & Nursing Care Foundation**, established by Family & Nursing Care, Inc. founder, Sandy Kursban. A fund of the Community Foundation in Montgomery County, the Foundation was created in 2008 with the goal of supporting older adults in two very important ways:

- Offering grants to help lower-income older adults gain access to the care they need to remain in their homes.
- Providing scholarships for students to earn a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) certificate in order to care for the aging population.

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MAKING AN IMPACT

Since its inception, the Foundation has supported three local nonprofit organizations: **Home Care Partners**, **Elderly Ministries program of the Community Ministries of Rockville**, and the **Jewish Social Service Agency (JSSA)**. Since 2009, the Family & Nursing Care Foundation has given \$30,000 annually (and \$40,000 in 2016) to Home Care Partners and Community Ministries. These funds have provided for more than 5,800 hours of comprehensive home care services each year, allowing 75 low-income seniors to remain in their homes. In 2016 the Foundation gave \$10,000 to JSSA, which enabled JSSA to provide 460 hours of home care to at-risk, aging Holocaust survivors.

In addition, the Family & Nursing Care Foundation has established a scholarship fund at Montgomery College to support students interested in pursuing training to become Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA). Through a partnership with the college, the Foundation has established a \$25,000 scholarship; \$5,000 will be awarded in each year of a five-year period to selected CNA candidates applying for financial assistance.
